People: We are Your people, O God, listen to our cry! Hear our prayers!
Liturgist: "For My house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations."
People: "These I will bring to My holy mountain, and make them joyful in My house of prayer; for My house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations."

- Unison Prayer: (Please be seated) Liturgist
God, we ask you to open the channel of communication between our spirits and your spirit. Not only hear our thoughts but allow us to hear your thoughts. Let your words speak to us and through us. Let our petitions arise to your throne room and hear what we ask. Thank you that Jesus has given us permission to pray in his name. Thank you that when we do not know how to pray, your Holy Spirit intercedes for us with groans and sighs that are deeper than mere human words. Thank you that when we pray Jesus intercedes for us at your right hand. We do not pray alone, by the Son and the Spirit pray with us and for us. It is in the name of Jesus that we pray each and every day. Amen.
- Responsive Reading and the Lord's Prayer Liturgist
Liturgist: The disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray.
People: He said, "When you pray, pray like this."
Liturgist: Then he taught them to pray as he did, and that is how we seek to pray as well.
People: When we pray as Christ did, we declare that You, O God, are our Father, and that You exist in the eternal realm of heaven with great power.
Liturgist: When we pray as Christ did, we give You honor and declare that Your name—and only Your name—is worthy to be worshipped!
People: When we pray to You as Christ did, we summon Your kingdom to come. That You reign in us and through us.
Liturgist: Whenever we pray to You as Christ did, You unleash Your will among us!
People: Whenever we pray as Christ did, Your will shall be accomplished on earth as it already is being accomplished in heaven!
Liturgist: When we pray as Christ taught, we pray for our daily bread. In the desert, Your people had no bread except what You miraculously provided every morning. They would gather it in baskets, enough for the day. So, Jesus teaches us to pray for the miracles we need for each day!
People: As we pray, forgive us of the sins we have committed in the same way we forgive those who have sinned against us.
Liturgist: As we pray, lead us away from the things that tempt us to sin.
People: As we pray, deliver us from the plots and scheming of the evil one.
Liturgist: As we pray, we declare that the Kingdom and authority is all Yours; and the power is all Yours; and the glory is all Yours.

People: We declare this to be the reality for now and evermore.

Liturgist: And this is how we pray like Jesus did.

People: And so, we now pray as he taught us to...

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.

Thy kingdom come!

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven!

**Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we
forgive those who trespass against us.**

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the Kingdom, and the Power, and the Glory forever. Amen.
